Full-Time Faculty Position in Biology or Environmental Science

The University of Dubuque invites applications for a full-time position in Biology or Environmental Science, beginning August 2022. The position will entail teaching introductory biology and/or environmental science classes and upper-level elective classes. The ideal candidate will bring a specialization in Ecology, Animal Physiology, Organismal Health, or related field; a commitment to pedagogical excellence; and a record of success in creating a hospitable classroom environment. A willingness to integrate faith and learning is highly desirable. Ongoing responsibilities include teaching 24 credit hours per year, advising students, maintaining a scholarship agenda, and participating in the broader life of the University. A Ph.D. is preferred, but Master's candidates who are willing to complete a doctorate will be considered.

About the University of Dubuque (UD): UD is a diverse, Christian, and forward-thinking educational community of 2,200 students that include approximately 1,500 traditional, full-time undergraduates. Our students come from 42 states and 28 countries and represent a variety of faith commitments. Of UD's diverse student body, 76% of UD's students are from outside the state of Iowa, 38% of students are from underrepresented racial and ethnic groups, 35% are from a lower socioeconomic status, and 33% are first-generation college students.

As a leader in student diversity among Iowa universities, UD seeks candidates who are committed to and can demonstrate success in working with multi-racial, multi-cultural, and multi-national students. As a Christian university, UD seeks candidates who can help us advance our commitment to the inherent worth of each individual, the search for truth, and the calling to use one's gifts in service to others. As a forward-thinking university, UD seeks candidates who embrace the next generation of students, with all of their strengths and challenges.

The University of Dubuque was founded in 1852 and maintains its historic ties to the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). In 1998, the University underwent what has come to be known as "The Plan for Transformation." Since the Transformation, student enrollment has grown from 600 to over 2,000, the endowment has grown from \$15 million to over \$250 million, and over \$200 million has been invested in new and renovated campus infrastructure. Most importantly, UD has clarified its missional focus as a diverse, Christian, and forward-thinking institution.
